Facility

All competition events and practice ice for Skate Kansas City 2002 will be held at Pepsi Ice Midwest, 12140 W 135th Street, Overland Park, KS. The facility had two ice surfaces 85' by 200' with rounded corners.

Rules and Eligibility

Skate Kansas City 2002 will be conducted according to the current USFSA rulebook unless otherwise stated in this announcement. Skaters must be eligible persons registered as members of the USFSA and may compete at their test level as of February 28th, 2002 or one level higher. Ages are as of February 28th, 2002.

Please note: Entry fees do not include practice ice. Practice ice is purchased separately.

Freeskating, when entered, is always considered the first event.

Entry Regulations

Entries must be postmarked on or before February 28th, 2002 and must include the entry fee. Please make checks payable to "The Kansas City Figure Skating Club". The use of metered postage is not accepted as proof of postmark. Any application postmarked after February 28th, 2002 will be considered a late entry. Late entries are accepted at the discretion of the competition committee. A late entry fee of \$25.00 will be charged. Two entries are sufficient to hold an event. **No refunds will be made after the entry deadline** unless the event is cancelled or closed due to a large number of entries. Send entries to:

Registration and Check-In

The registration desk will be located at Pepsi Ice Midwest. Skaters may check-in on Thursday, April 11, 2002 starting 1 hour prior to the first practice ice session. Please register immediately upon arrival. The registration desk will be open approximately 1 hour before the first event each day and will remain open until the completion of the final event of the day. Skaters should plan on being at the rink at least 45 minutes prior to their scheduled event. Always check the official bulletin board for announcements of any possible changes.

Practice Ice

No official Practice Ice is included with your registration fee. Practice Ice will cost \$8 for each session for singles event, \$12 per skater for partner events. All Sessions are 30 minutes. Refer to the enclosed Practice Ice form for additional information. Please fill out the Practice Ice request form completely. Skaters may request up to three single event or two partner practice sessions on a pre-paid basis. Additional ice, if available, will be sold on a first come, first served basis during registration. Final round practice ice will be reserved and those skaters qualifying will be given the opportunity to purchase it. Every effort will be made to play every competitor's music, but this cannot be guaranteed.

Music

Solo Dance music will be provided. Competitors must provide music for all other events. Only cassettes or CDs (standard CD-R format only) will be accepted. Cassette tapes and CDs must be clearly marked with a competitor's name, event, and running time. The official competition cassette or CD must be turned in at the Registration Desk at the time of registration. CD's must be turned in with jewel case. Cassettes or CD must only have one piece of music per cassette or CD. Cassettes and CDs may be picked up at the Registration Desk following each event. The official competition cassette turned in at the Registration Desk is reserved for use during the event and may not be retrieved for Practice Ice use. Please keep adequate copies of your tape(s) or CDs available.

Awards

Trophies will be awarded for the top four placements in all Championship final rounds. Team Trophies will be awarded for the top three placements in Synchronized Skating events. For all other events, including the Championship initial round events, medals will be awarded for the top four placements. All awards will be distributed and pictures taken immediately following the posting of the results. Medals can be engraved at an additional cost after the awards have been presented. The Skate KC trophy will be awarded to the club that accumulates the most points based on the following: four points for 1st place decreasing to one point for 4th place. All participating clubs are included. Pair/Dance teams must declare what club points are to be awarded if both skaters are not from the same club.

Photography/ Video

No flash photography of the skaters on the ice is permitted. No tripods may be used and no rink power sources may be accessed. Only hand held video cameras are permitted. Photos and videos will be taken by Local Motion from Colorado Springs, CO. You can supply your own videotape or purchase one at the competition.

Skaters may skate up one level higher than the freeskating test passed as of the entry deadline.
Age specific divisions will be divided by age as 2/28/2002. Beginner thru Preliminary events will be divided by age.
Pre-Juvenile thru Senior will be randomly seeded.

Championship Freeskating

The following events will be held in a Championship format. When entries merit more than one group, initial rounds will be held. The number of skaters moving on to a final round from each initial round event will be posted at the competition. Intermediate through Senior events are NOT combined with short programs.

Championship Short Programs

Short Program will be offered at the Intermediate, Novice, Junior and Senior levels. **Required elements and times are those for the 2002-2003 season found in current rulebook.** (Fall 2002 Regionals) This is a Championship event and a final round will be held if entries warrant. The number of skaters moving on to a final round from each initial round event will be posted at the competition.

Compulsory Moves

Eligibility is the same as for Free Skating. Compulsory moves are skated without music. The specified moves may be done in any order but must be skated exactly as described. An axel is a single jump. Step Sequences must be distinguishable from connecting steps. In Limited Beginner through PreJuvenile Compulsory Moves events where there are insufficient entries at a particular level, groups may be combined and male and female entrants judged together.

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Beginner through Pre-Juv/Open Pre-Juvenile compulsories are performed on 1/4 ice.

Limited Pre-Pre	1 Minute	Toe Loop, Salchow, Forward Spiral, 1 foot Upright Spin with a minimum of 3 revolutions.
Pre-Preliminary	1 minute	Loop, Salchow, Forward Outside Spiral , 1 foot Back Spin (Min 3 revs), connecting steps.
Preliminary	1 minute	Combination jump consisting of 2 single jumps, Flip, Sit Spin (Minimum 3 revs), Forward Inside Spiral, connecting steps.
Pre-Juvenile & Open Pre-Juvenile	1 min 15 secs	Combination jump consisting of 2 single jumps 1 of which is a loop, Lutz, Forward Scratch Spin to Back Scratch Spin -exit on spinning foot, Camel Spin, (All spins 3 revs min each foot), Ina Bauer or Forward Inside Spiral, connecting steps.

Juvenile and Open Juvenile compulsories utilize the full ice surface.

Juvenile & Open Juvenile	1.5 minutes	Combination jump consisting of 2 single jumps or 1 double and 1 single jump, Axel, Sit-change-sit Spin, Layback Spin (girls) or Camel Spin (boys), Straight line Step Sequence, Choice of one (1) of the following: Ina Bauer, Spread Eagle or Forward Spiral. (All spins minimum of 4 revs each foot).
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Adult Compulsories Gold Adult will use full ice, all others 1/4 ice.

Pre-Bronze	1 minute	Waltz jump, any 1/2 jump, 2 foot Spin (min 3 revs), Forward Spiral.
Bronze	1 minute	Salchow, Waltz Jump-Toe Loop combination. 1 foot upright spin (min. 4 revs.), backward Spiral.
Silver	1.5 minutes	Single-Single combination jump, Flip, Combination spin with One change of position (3 revs per pos), Spiral Step Sequence.
Gold	1.5 minutes	Axel, single-single Combination Jump , Sit Spin, Spiral Step Sequence, Combination Spin with 1 change of foot 1 change pos (4 revs per foot).

Artistic Freeskating

Eligibility is the same as for Free Skating events. Choice of music (vocals allowed) is up to the skater. Costumes may be of any type as long as they are not a safety hazard. Judging will be based on originality, creativity, and musical interpretation which characterizes the mood of the music. There are no open events.

Pre-Preliminary through Juvenile 1.5 minutes maximum

Intermediate through Senior and Adult 2 minute maximum

Spin Events

Spins shall be skated in a **SIMPLE PROGRAM** with no jumps of any kind and no extra or repeated elements. Connecting moves and short sequences of footwork may be used between spins and will not be judged. All events will be skated on $\frac{1}{2}$ ice. Maximum time for all levels will be 1.5 minutes.

Preliminary	One foot forward scratch spin, forward camel spin, forward sit spin.
Pre-Juvenile & Open Pre-Juv	Forward camel spin, forward sit spin, combination spin with no change of foot and one change of position.
Juvenile & Open Juvenile	Ladies: attitude or layback spin; Men: forward camel spin, sit change sit with minimum of 4 revolutions each foot, camel change sit spin – 4 revolutions each foot.
Intermediate	Flying camel with 4 revolutions minimum in position, combination spin with 2 changes of position and 1 change of foot with 4 revolutions minimum each foot, sit spin with minimum 4 revolution in position.
Novice	Camel change Camel spin with 5 revolutions on each foot, Layback spin with 5 revolutions minimum in position, combination spin with 2 changes of position and 1 change of foot with a minimum of 5 revolutions each foot.
Junior	Flying spin of skater's choice with a minimum of 6 revolutions in position, layback spin (ladies) or crossfoot spin (men) with a minimum of 5 revolutions, Combination spin with 1 change of foot and 2 changes of position with a minimum 6 revolutions each foot.
Senior	Flying spin of skaters choice with minimum of 8 revolutions in position, Solo spin of skaters choice (No flying entry) with 8 revolutions in position. Camel jump camel with a minimum of 5 revolutions per foot. Combination spin with 1 change of foot and at least 2 changes of positions with a minimum of 8 revolutions each foot.

Pairs

Program requirements are according to the current rulebook. Short Programs elements are the elements for the 2002-2003 season. .

Jumps

There is no music played for this event. Entrants will qualify according to their Free Skating Level. Beginner through Juvenile will skate on half ice, Intermediate through Senior on full ice. Jumps should be skated exactly as stated and in this order. Skaters will be given two opportunities to perform each jump and will be judged on the best one. **This is not a "mini-program"**. Only the stroking and edges necessary to prepare for the jump will be allowed. Extra moves, such as spirals, pivots, etc will be penalized. **This event will be conducted as follows:** At the conclusion of the warm up period, the first skater will present the first jump twice, then (for Intermediate and higher) the second jump twice, and then the combination jump twice. The judges will score only the best performance of each jump. The process will then be repeated for Skater #2, and the rest of the skaters. An axel will be considered a single jump. In situations where the skater is given a choice of the jumps to be performed, the first attempt will determine the jumps to be judged and the skater will not be allowed to change jumps on the second attempt.

Toe loop, Single/Single combination (No axel)

Flip or Lutz, Single/Loop combination

Axel, any Double jump.

Juvenile & Open Juvenile

Axel, Double Loop, Double/Double combination

Novice

Double Loop, Double Flip, Double/Double combination

Junior

Double Loop, Double Lutz, combination of any two double jumps or a triple jump with a double jump.

Senior

Double Lutz, Double Axel, combination of any two double jumps or a triple jump with a double jump.

Solo Dance

Places will be determined by the combined score of both dances. Skaters may skate up as high as they wish, but may not skate below their current test level. The number of patterns for each dance will be according to the current rulebook.

Bronze	Cha-Cha and Fiesta Tango, No more than 2 Pre-Silver dances passed.

Pre-Gold	Blues & Killian, no more than 2 Gold Dances passed.
Gold	Paso Doble & Quickstep
Adult Bronze	Dutch Waltz and Rhythm Blues. No test requirements.
Adult Silver	Fiesta Tango & Willow Waltz, No test requirements.
Adult Gold	American Waltz & Blues. No test requirements.
