GENERAL INFORMATION

The 2003 Magnolia Open Basic Skills competition is designed to promote a fun introduction to the competitive sport of figure skating for the beginning skater. The competition is open to Snowplow Sam, Basic 1 - 8, No Test and Freeskate 1 - 6 (and ISI equivalents) skaters and will be conducted in accordance with the rules set forth in the 2003 USFSA Rulebook (where applicable), except as noted in this announcement. For clarification of skating terms and elements, please review the USFSA Skate with U.S. Basic Skills program.

ELIGIBILITY

Membership in the United States Figure Skating Association (USFSA) or the Ice Skating Institute (ISI) is not necessary. The competition is open to all beginner skaters who are either enrolled in a class program or receiving private instruction at the beginner level. Any skater who has passed the USFSA Pre-Preliminary test or higher is ineligible.

RULES

Wherever applicable, USFSA rules will apply. All other rules are outlined in this announcement. Skaters will be divided by age into groups of six skaters or less in all divisions. All events are separate, and there will be no final rounds. The Competition Committee reserves the right to limit the number of entries due to time constraints.

AWARDS

Awards will be presented to all six participants at each level.

FACILITY

The ice surface at The Cooler measures 200' x 85' with rounded corners and barrier boards.

APPLICATION DEADLINE

Entries must be postmarked no later than midnight, February 8, 2003.

ENTRY SUBMISSIONS

1. Entries must be postmarked by MIDNIGHT, February 8, 2003. Mail to the following address:

2. Entries received after February 8, 2003 will be considered late and will be accepted at the discretion of the Chief Referee. These entries will be assessed a \$25.00 late fee.

PAYMENT AND REFUNDS

- Competitors remitting checks with insufficient funds will be charged an additional \$25.00 fee per check.
 All further payments must be made by cash or money order. Skaters will not be allowed to compete until all such debts are satisfied.
- 2. Entry refunds will be available under the following conditions:
 - The competition or an event is cancelled
 - The competitor provides a physician's letter certifying that a medical condition prevents the skater from safely competing
 - There is a death in the competitor's immediate family
- 3. No refunds will be issued because of competition cancellation due to acts of God.

SCHEDULE AVAILABILITY

Check the Atlanta Figure Skating Club website at www.afsc.us for the competition schedule, information, and times. The event schedule will be posted on the website and posted on the official bulletin board at The Cooler two weeks prior to the competition. Schedules will also be mailed to competitors who include a legal-sized, self-addressed, stamped envelope with their entry forms.

REGISTRATION AND MUSIC

The registration desk will be located at The Cooler ice arena and will be open before the start of the competition and thereafter during the scheduled events. Cassette tapes ONLY must be turned in at the time of registration, at least one hour prior to the event. Please label rewound tape with name and event. An extra copy of the competitor's tape should be available at all times in the event of technical difficulties.

VIDEOTAPING AND PHOTOGRAPHY SERVICES

Professional videotaping and photography services will be available throughout the competition.

PRACTICE ICE

Practice ice availability at The Cooler will not be determined until the close of entries. A reservation form will be mailed with the event schedule to competitors who include a legal-sizes, SASE with their entry forms. Each 30 minute practice ice session will be \$10.00, limited to the first 20 skaters.


