

2003 White Rose Invitational

Hosted by The White Rose Figure Skating Club

At the York City Ice Arena, 941 Vander Ave., York, Pennsylvania

May 9-11, 2003

Entries: The competition is open to all amateur skaters who are members in good standing with the USFSA. The competition will be conducted in accordance with the rules of the 2003-2004 Rule Book. The competition committee reserves the right to limit the number of competitors in each flight and in each category, to combine or divide groups, and in the events where fewer than three competitors apply, to eliminate the category.

Eligibility: Skaters may enter as many events as they choose and for which they meet the eligibility requirements. A skater may compete at one level higher than the skater's USFSA test level (freestyle). Age and test status as of March 26, 2003 will determine the competitor's eligibility.

Awards: Medals will be awarded to the first, second, third, and fourth place finishers in each group. A trophy will be awarded to the winner of each skate-off

Skate-off: In each **Freeskating event** made up of more than one group, an equal number of top finishers from each group will advance to the skate-off championship round. Each championship round will have a maximum of 12 skaters.

Entry Fees: Entry fees are as follows: First Event-\$60.00 Additional Events-\$25.00. All entry fees must accompany the entry form. Make checks payable to the White Rose FSC. A \$20 fee will be charged for all returned checks. Entries must be **postmarked by March 26, 2003**. Late entries will be accepted at the discretion of the Competition Committee. There will be an additional fee of \$25.00 for late entries. Refunds will be made in accordance with the USFSA Rule Book rule CR33.05

Entries must be sent by regular mail only – entries sent by registered mail or other types of mail that must be signed for **will not be accepted.**

Schedule: A tentative competition schedule will be posted on our web site at www.wrfsc.org as soon as it is available. A schedule will be sent to all competitors who include a **self-addressed stamped envelope** with their entry form.

Practice Ice: Practice ice may be available depending on the final schedule. If available a tentative schedule of practice ice will be sent with event schedules.

Music: cassettes and CD's will be accepted. Tapes & CDs must be clearly marked with the name of the skater and the event. Tapes & CDs should be turned in at least one hour before the event. **Competitors are reminded to bring a back-up tape.**

Registration: Please register at the registration desk upon arrival. You must register at least one hour prior to your scheduled event.

Admission: There will be NO admission charge for spectators.

Video: If personal videotaping is done, only battery-operated cameras may be used.

Locker Rooms: Locker Rooms will be available.

Rink Facilities: All events will be held at the York City Ice Arena which has twin ice surfaces each measuring 200' X 85'. There will be a snack bar open during the competition.

Directions to Rink

From Harrisburg: I-83 South to Exit 16-B (old exit 6), Queen Street - North. Turn right onto Queen Street and continue to 3rd traffic light. Turn right on Rathon Road. Take 2nd left onto Edgar Street. Proceed two blocks to stop sign. Turn right on Rockdale Avenue. York City Ice Arena is approximately one block ahead on left. Parking is on the right, across from the rink.

From Baltimore: I-83 North to Exit 16-B (old exit 6), Queen Street - North. Turn right onto Queen Street and follow directions as above from Queen Street.

From Lancaster: US 30 West to first traffic light, at North Hills Road. Turn left onto North Hills Road. Go to 2nd traffic light and turn right onto Market Street. Take immediate right onto I-83 South. Follow directions as if coming from Harrisburg.

From Gettysburg: US 30 East to I-83 South- Follow directions as if coming from Harrisburg.

Things to see: York, Pennsylvania, our nations first capital, is located within an easy drive of the major tourist attractions of Gettysburg, Hershey, and Lancaster. On Sunday May 11th York will feature its annual "**Olde York Street Fair**" with local crafts, music, food, and entertainment.

Event Requirements

Skaters may skate at their test level or one level higher in all events.

Singles Freestyle

Level	Requirements
Tots	Skaters who are age 7 and under, no tests passed, Jumps allowed are: waltz, salchow, toe loop, ½flip, and ½lutz. Time 1-1 ½minutes
No-Test	Skaters who are 8 and over, no tests passed, No axels or double jumps allowed. Time 1 ½minutes.
Pre-Preliminary	Skaters who have passed Pre-Preliminary FS, but no higher. Axel, No double jumps. Time 1 ½minutes.
Preliminary	Skaters who have passed Preliminary FS, but no higher. Axel plus two double jumps, which may be repeated in combination. Time 1 ½minutes
Pre-Juvenile	Skaters who have passed Pre-Juvenile FS, but no higher. Axel plus four double jumps, which may be repeated in combination. Time 2 minutes
Juvenile	Skaters 12 and under who have passed Juvenile FS, but no higher. Time 2 ¼ minutes.
Open Juvenile	Skaters 13 and over who have passed Juvenile FS, but no higher. Time 2 ¼ minutes.
Intermediate	Skaters who have passed Intermediate FS, but no higher. Time 2 ½ minutes.
Novice	Skaters who have passed Novice FS, but no higher. Time Ladies 3 minutes Men 3 ½Minutes
Junior	Skaters who have passed Junior FS, but no higher. Time 3 ½minutes for ladies and 4 minutes for men.
Senior	Skaters who have passed Senior FS, but no higher. Time 4 minutes for ladies and 4 ½minutes for men
Adult Bronze	Skaters 25 years or older who have passed adult Bronze FS but no higher. No axel or double jumps. Max time 1 min. 40 sec.
Adult Silver	Skaters 25 years or older who have passed adult Silver FS but no higher. No axels. Max time 2 min. 10 sec.
Adult Gold	Skaters 25 years or older who have passed adult Gold FS but no higher. Max time 2 min. 40 sec.

Short Programs Age and test requirements are the same as listed for Singles Freestyle. All short programs will be conducted according to the required elements for the 2003-2004 competitive season.

Level	Requirements	Time Limit
Intermediate	Passed Intermediate FS, but no higher	2 minutes
Novice	Passed Novice FS, but no higher	2 minutes.15 seconds
Junior	Passed Junior FS, but no higher	2 minutes 40 seconds
Senior	Passed Senior FS, but no higher	2 minutes 40 seconds

Compulsory Moves - Age and test requirements are the same as listed for Singles Freestyle. No music will be used. Elements may be skated in any order. Failed elements may not be re-tried. Additional jumps or spins are not permitted and will result in a deduction. Tots, No-Test, Pre-Preliminary, Preliminary, and Pre-Juvenile will be done on $\frac{1}{4}$ the ice surface. Juvenile will use the full ice surface. Male skaters may be placed with female skaters for this event.

Level	Requirements
Tots	2 bunny hops in a row, lunge, forward spiral, 2-foot spin (min. 3 Rev.) Time 1 minute max.
No-Test	2 bunny hops in a row, lunge, forward spiral, 2-foot spin (min. 3 Rev.) Time 1 minute max.
Pre-Preliminary	Waltz jump, half flip, salchow, back spiral, one foot spin (min. 3 Rev.) Time 1 minute max.
Preliminary	Waltz Jump-Toe Loop combination (no step or turn in between), flip jump, forward power three turns in succession in one direction, forward spiral on a curve, sit spin (min. 3 Rev.) Time 1 minute max.
Pre-Juvenile	Flip jump, lutz jump, split jump, 5-step Mohawk sequence in each direction, camel-sit spin (min. 5 Rev.). Time 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ minutes max.
Juvenile	Axel, flip, lutz-loop combination (no step or turn in between), backward power 3-turns in both directions, choice of camel-sit-change-sit spin (min 4 rev. on each foot) or layback spin (min 6 rev.) Time 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ minutes max.

Artistic – Programs will be judged on artistic impression and interpretation of the music. Costumes should reflect the mood of the music. No props allowed. Male and female skaters will be combined for this event.

Level	Requirements
Preliminary	No-Test through Preliminary Free. No axel, doubles, or triples. Time 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ minutes.
Pre-Juvenile/Juvenile	Pre-Juvenile through Juvenile. No Doubles or triples. Time 2 minutes.
Intermediate/Novice	Intermediate through Novice. Axel and one Doubles allowed, no triples. Time 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ minutes.
Junior/ Senior	Junior through Senior. Axel plus two doubles allowed no triples. Time 3 minutes.
Adult	Open to all adults age 25 and over. Time 2 minutes

Showcase – Emphasis is placed on the illustration of the character through the music interpretation, costumes, props, and audience appeal. Props must be carried on and off the ice by the skater in one trip. No jumps higher than an axel. Male and female skaters will be combined for this event.

Preliminary	No-Test through Preliminary Free. Time 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ minutes.
Pre-Juvenile/Juvenile	Pre-Juvenile through Juvenile. Time 2 minutes.
Intermediate/Novice	Intermediate through Novice. Time 2 minutes.
Junior/ Senior	Junior through Senior. Time 2 minutes
Adults	Adults age 25 and over Time 2 minutes

Spins - Age and test requirements are the same as listed for Singles Freestyle. No music will be used. Spins may be skated in any order. Failed elements may not be re-tried. Connecting moves such as footwork may be used, but will not be judged.. Minimum revolutions for each spin are shown in the () below. All levels will be on $\frac{1}{4}$ the ice surface. Male skaters may be placed with female skaters for this event.

Adult Level A (Bronze or Silver)	Upright one foot spin (4 Rev)

Adult Level B (Gold or Masters)	Upright one foot spin (4 Rev)	
	Sit spin (3 Rev)

Jumps - Age and test requirements are the same as listed for Singles Freestyle. No-Test through Pre-Juvenile will be skated on $\frac{1}{2}$ ice, Juvenile and above will be skated on full ice. Jumps must be performed exactly as stated. Skaters will be given two opportunities to perform each jump and will be judged on the best one. The following format will be used for this event: The first skater will take the ice and attempt the first jump twice, pause and then attempt the second jump twice, etc. The next skater will then do the same. Male and female skaters will be combined for this event.

Adult level A (Bronze or Silver)	Toe Loop Combination of any two single jumps (no axel)
Adult Level B (Gold or Master)	Loop Combination of any two single jumps
