## TWENTY-SEVENTH ANNUAL ROCKFORD OPEN COMPETITION

June 23-26, 2005

A non-qualifying competition sanctioned by The United States Figure Skating Association

The Figure Skating Club of Rockford cordially invites you to participate in the 27th Annual Rockford Open Figure Skating Competition to be held June 23-26, 2005, at Carlson Arctic Ice Arena, Loves Park, Illinois. Woody Weir will be the Referee; the Accountant will be Jim Achtenberg.

**RULES and ELIGIBILITY** This non-qualifying competition will be conducted in accordance with the rules and regulations of the USFSA as set forth in the official rulebook. All qualified amateurs, Beginner (no USFSA or CFSA tests passed) through Senior, are eligible to participate if registered with the USFSA or CFSA for 2005. Skaters may compete in as many events as qualified by their test level as of May 15, 2005, or at one level higher.

**ENTRY FORMS and FEES** *Entries must be postmarked by May 15, 2005.* The entry fee for individual events is \$75.00 per competitor for the first event, and \$25.00 for each additional event. Competitors in Juvenile through Senior levels may skate in Championship Events and will skate both their long and short programs. The entry fees for Championship Events are \$100.00 per competitor. Each subsequent event will be an additional \$25.00. Juvenile skaters may skate an Intermediate Short Program for Juveniles only. Pair's entry fees are \$40.00 per skater for the first pair's event and \$25.00 per skater for each additional pair's event. Pair's skaters competing in singles events will follow the fee schedules listed above. Each partner must submit an application. Completed applications will be processed as of postmark date and entered based on date entry is received. The Figure Skating Club of Rockford reserves the right to limit the number of competitors per event. After all places in an event are full, additional entries will be returned.

All entries postmarked after May 15, 2005 will be assessed a \$25.00 late fee or may not be accepted. There will be a \$25.00 service fee for any checks returned for any reason (examples: NSF, no signature, etc.) All skaters' fees (including late fees and service charges) must be paid in full before the skater will be allowed to compete. Fees must accompany applications in the form of check or money order (not cash) payable to the Figure Skating Club of Rockford. Please mail your entry form, payment, and a self-addressed stamped envelope to Kris Mimier, Rockford Open Entries, 6118 Valley Knoll Drive, Rockford IL 61109.

No refunds will be given unless the event is canceled for lack of participation. In accordance with USFSA guidelines, no refunds will be issued except for medical reasons and at the discretion of the competition chairman. Two entries will constitute an event and boys and girls may be combined in spin events if necessary.

**FACILITIES, REGISTRATION, and MUSIC** The Rockford Open competition will be held June 23-26, 2005, at the Carlson Arctic Ice Arena, 4150 N. Perryville Rd., Loves Park, IL, (located near Interstate 90 and Riverside Blvd.). The ice surface at Carlson Arctic Ice Arena measures 85 feet by 200 feet with slightly rounded corners. The Registration Desk will be open at the Carlson Arctic Ice Arena beginning at 6:00pm. On Wednesday, June 22, 2005 and during all events. At the time of registration, each skater must turn in their own music cassette or CD clearly labeled with the competitor's name, event, and home club **ON THE SIDE TO BE PLAYED**. The tape should be rewound. All music must be turned in at time of registration and picked up after the event. **NO TAPES WILL BE MAILED.**

A duplicate, rewound tape should be readily available rink-side during the event. All schedules will be posted on the official bulletin board at Carlson Arctic Ice Arena. It is the

responsibility of each competitor to check this board for official schedules and notices. Each skater must be checked in and present at the rink a minimum of one hour prior to scheduled events.

**PRACTICE ICE** Practice ice will be available at the Carlson Arctic Ice Arena beginning Wednesday, June 22 through June 26, 2005. You may purchase one practice ice session per day in advance (see Practice Ice Reservation Form). The cost will be \$7 per 30-minute session and payment must accompany the Practice Ice Reservation form. There will be a \$25 service fee for checks returned for any reason and all skaters' fees (including service charges) must be paid in full before the skater will be allowed to skate on practice ice. All practice ice will be assigned on a first come, first served basis and will be scheduled prior to skater's first event of the day. The Practice Ice Reservation Form may be submitted with your completed Official Entry Form or you may wait until you receive your event times to purchase practice ice. Skaters purchasing practice ice in advance will be notified of their practice ice times along with event times. Additional practice ice, if available, may be purchased at the Practice Ice Desk, which will be located at Carlson Arctic Ice Arena beginning Wednesday, June 22, 2005. Tapes will not be played during practice sessions.

**AWARDS, PHOTOGRAPHS, and VIDEO TAPING** Medals will be awarded to the top five places and ribbons to remaining places for No Test through Individual Short & Individual Freeskate (Long) Program events. Trophies will be awarded to the top five places for Intermediate through Senior Championship Events. Awards will be presented on the podium immediately following completion of the event and posting of the results. The official photographer will take award pictures immediately after they are presented. Videotaping will also be available for an individual competitor's performance. Sign up for this service at the Carlson Arctic Ice Arena Registration Desk.

**DIRECTIONS TO Carlson Arctic Ice Arena** I-90 (from east, south, or north): Exit Riverside Blvd/Loves Park, Machesney Park, Rockford. Continue west for 1 mile (from east or south) or .8 miles (from north). Turn right (north) onto Perryville Rd. (2<sup>nd</sup> traffic light). Drive north for .4 miles. Turn left onto Rock Valley Parkway. Turn left onto Auto Park Dr. (.1 mile).

**From East State St. I-90 Exit:** Go West on East State St to Perryville Rd. Turn right (North) onto Perryville and continue north for several miles. Cross E. Riverside Blvd. Carlson Arctic Ice Arena is on the left (west).

## GENERAL RULES

- a. The effective test date is May 15, 2005.
- b. As the number of entries warrant, events may be divided into two or more groups.
- c. In the case of too few entries, events may be combined or canceled at the discretion of the Referee.
- d. Boys and girls may be combined in spin events. In the case of the cancellation of the event, entry fees for that event will be refunded.
- e. Juvenile skaters must be age 12 or younger by May 15, 2005. Open Juvenile skaters must be age 13 or older by May 15, 2005. Adults must be age 25 or older by May 15, 2005.
- f. A Beginner is a person who has passed no USFSA or CFSA tests.
- g. Skaters may elect to enter events at one level higher than that for which they are qualified but may not enter the same event at two different levels.

**1. FREE SKATING AND SHORT PROGRAM:** Juvenile Level through Senior Level skaters can skate their Short Program and their Free skating Program as individual events or as Championship events. Those skaters electing to skate in the Championship events will skate both programs the Short Program and the Free Skating Program. Final positions for the Championship events will be determined by combining the results of both the Short Program and the Free Skating Program. If numbers permit there will be a final round for the Championship events two or more groups at any level Juvenile level through Senior level (Ladies and or Men). Skaters qualifying for the final round in the Championship events will only be required to skate the Free Skating Program. The Group sizes for the Individual and Championship events will be determined based on the U. S. F. S. 2005 Rulebook. Medals will be awarded to the top five skaters for each Individual Event. Trophies will be awarded to the top five skaters in the final round Championship Events.

### 3. COMPULSORY MOVES (Eligibility by test level same as for Free Skating.)

- There will be no music for Beginner through Juvenile and Open Juvenile levels.
- Skaters will skate the moves without stopping between each move.
- Moves may be skated in any order but must be skated exactly as requested.
- In combination jumps, no change of foot or turn between jumps is allowed (use of toe picks of the other foot for toe jumps is not considered a change of foot.)  
The two Jumps in the combination can be skated in any order.
- An Axel is considered to be a single jump.
- While skaters may perform interesting connecting steps between moves, excessive foot work and/or added elements will be penalized.
- Skaters may use less time, but not exceed the times listed in the following table.
- Limited Beginner through Juvenile/Open Juvenile events will be skated on one-half ice surface. Intermediate, Novice, Junior, and Senior Short Programs will be skated on full ice surface to music.
