General Information

- **ELIGIBILITY:** Entrants must be members in good standing of U. S. Figure Skating. All test and age requirements are as of May 31, 2005. A minimum of two (2) entries will be required for all flights to be scheduled. Skaters will be grouped by age whenever possible and divided into smaller groups if necessary. You may enter the event for which you have passed the required test by May 31, 2005, or one level higher, *but not both.*
- **RULES**: The Competition will be conducted according to the rules of U.S. Figure Skating Rulebook and will follow guidelines for the 2005-2006 competition season, except as stated herein.
- ENTRIES: Entries must be postmarked no later than May 31, 2005. WFSC reserves the right to close entries early if spaces for particular level(s) are filled. If space permits, late entries may be accepted at the discretion of WFSC with a late entry fee. No refunds will be granted except for events cancelled by WFSC. Send entries to: Wisconsin FSC, P.O. - FEES: \$75 for the first event entered at the Juvenile through Senior level, except solo dance \$55 for the first event entries at the Pre-Juvenile and below level, except solo dance \$30 for each additional event entered
 - \$45 for first solo dance; \$30 for each additional solo dance
 - Short Program and Long Program are considered separate events. Pairs skaters should split the fee (50% each). If a competitor is skating in both Singles and Pairs events, then the Singles event will be considered the first event. **Make** checks payable to WFSC. Fees must accompany the entry form. There will be a \$20 fee charged for all returned checks.
- **RINK:** The Milwaukee School of Engineering (MSOE) Kern Center rink is an NHL size rink (200' x 85'). The facility offers skate sharpening, concessions and a juice/coffee bar, and is located in downtown Milwaukee, just a few blocks from Interstates 43 and 94, and close to shopping, restaurants and hotels.
- MUSIC: Competitors must submit music on a separate media source (tape or CD) for each competitive program. CDs with multiple tracks will not be accepted. Tapes and CDs should be clearly marked with the skater's name and event and duplicate copies must be readily available during the competitive event. Tapes should be turned in without cases. CDs should be in a case or envelope. WFSC assumes no responsibility or liability due to lost, damaged or unclaimed music sources.
- **AWARDS:** Medals will be presented to all 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th place winners in each group. There will be no final rounds.
- **OFFICIAL NOTICES:** Posting of schedules and announcements will occur at an official bulletin board at the rink, and shall constitute sufficient official notice to competitors, coaches, and officials.
- **SCHEDULE**: A tentative schedule will be posted on the Website by June 10, 2005, and individual confirmations will be mailed soon thereafter.
- PRACTICE ICE: Practice ice will be available on Friday, Saturday and Sunday (July 8, 9 & 10). Practice ice information will be available by May 1, 2005 at www.wisconsinfsc.org/SkateWisconsin.html

EVENTS

- You may enter the event for which you have passed the required test by May 31, 2005, or one level higher, *but not both.* Short and long programs are separate events. Unless otherwise noted, times are +/- 10 seconds. The following events will be offered:
 - Free Skate (Beginner through Senior, Adult)
 - Compulsory Moves (Beginner through Juvenile)
 - Spins (Pre-preliminary through Senior)
 - Pairs
 - Solo Dance
 - Artistic Showcase

*** Program requirements at all levels will be according to the 2004/2005 U.S. FIGURE SKATING Rulebook unless otherwise stated***

EVENT: FREE SKATE

- **Beginner:** 1:30 minutes +/- 10 seconds. May not have passed the Pre-Preliminary Free Skate test. May include 1/2 revolution jumps, plus salchows and toe loops. May not include flying spins or combination spins.
- Pre-Preliminary Limited: 1:30 minutes +/- 10 seconds. Open to skaters who have passed the Pre-Preliminary Free Skate test and no higher. May not include Axels or double jumps.
- **Pre-Preliminary:** 1:30 minutes +/- 10 seconds. Open to skaters who have passed the Pre-Preliminary Free Skate test and no higher. May include Axels. May not include double jumps.
- **Preliminary:** 1:30 minutes +/- 10 seconds. Open to skaters who have passed the Preliminary Free Skate test and no higher. Program may contain Axels, double jumps and flying spins. Only 2 different double jumps are allowed but may be repeated individually or in combination.
- **Pre-Juvenile:** 2 minutes +/- 10 seconds. Open to skaters who have passed the Pre-Juvenile Free Skate test and no higher. Only 4 different double jumps are allowed but may be repeated individually, in combination, or in a sequence.
- Open-Juvenile: 2:15 minutes +/- 10 seconds. Open to skaters who have passed the Juvenile Free Skate test and no higher, and who have reached the age of 13 by May 31, 2005. Program requirements according to 2004-2005 U.S. Figure Skating rulebook.
- **Juvenile:** 2:15 minutes +/- 10 seconds. Open to skaters who have passed the Juvenile Free Skate test and no higher, and who have not reached the age of 13 by May 31, 2005. Program requirements according to 2004-2005 U.S. Figure Skating rulebook.
- **Intermediate Long Program:** 2:30 minutes +/- 10 seconds. Open to skaters who have passed the Intermediate Free Skate test and no higher. Program requirements according to 2004-2005 U.S. Figure Skating rulebook.

EVENT: FREE SKATE (continued)

- **Novice Long Program:** 3 minutes +/- 10 seconds (Ladies). 3:30 minutes +/- 10 seconds (Men). Open to skaters who have passed the Novice Free Skate test and no higher. Program requirements according to 2004-2005 U.S. Figure Skating rulebook.
- Junior Long Program: 3:30 minutes +/- 10 seconds (Ladies). 4 minutes +/- 10 seconds (Men). Open to skaters who have passed the Junior Free Skate test and no higher. Program requirements according to 2004-2005 U.S. Figure Skating rulebook.
- Senior Long Program: 4 minutes +/- 10 seconds (Ladies). 4:30 minutes +/- 10 seconds (Men). Open to skaters who have passed the Senior Free Skate test. Program requirements according to 2004-2005 U.S. Figure Skating rulebook.

Event: Adult Free Skate

Must be 25 years or older as of May 31, 2005.

- Adult Pre-Bronze: 1:40 minutes maximum. May have passed Adult Pre-Bronze Free Skate Test. Single jumps only; no Axels.
- Adult Bronze: 1:40 minutes maximum. May have passed Adult Bronze Free Skate Test. Single jumps only; no Axels.
- Adult Silver: 2:10 minutes maximum. May have passed Adult Silver Free Skate Test. Single jumps only. Axels are permitted.
- Adult Gold: 2:40 minutes maximum. May have passed Adult Gold Free Skate Test.
- Adult Masters: 2:40 minutes maximum. Must be 25 years or older by closing date. Must have passed at least Intermediate Free Skate Test.

Event: Compulsory Moves

Test requirements are the same as for Free Skating Events at the same level. No Music. Elements may be skated in any order. There will be an emphasis on stroking (power and edge quality) at all levels.

- **Beginner:** 1 minute maximum; half ice. Bunny hops--two in a row, Waltz jump, 1/2 flip, forward spiral, 1 foot spin (minimum 3 revolutions)
- **Pre-Preliminary:** 1 minute maximum. Lunge, Forward spiral on a curve, Salchow, Waltz jump toe loop combination, Scratch spin (minimum 3 revolutions)
- **Preliminary**: 1 minute maximum; half ice. Diagonal step sequence, Filp, Single-single jump combo (may include Axel), Back spiral, Sit spin (minimum 3 revolutions)

EVENT: COMPULSORY MOVES (continued)

- **Pre-Juvenile:** 1 minute maximum; half ice. Diagonal step sequence, Lutz, Axel, Single-single jump combo, Spiral sequence with two spirals, Sit change sit (minimum 4 revolutions each foot)
- Juvenile: 1 minute to 1:30 minutes; full ice. Axel, Double Salchow or Double Toe-Loop, Circular footwork (must be a complete circle), Girls Layback spin (minimum 3 revolutions), Boys Camel spin (minimum 3 revolutions), Lutz jump/loop jump combination (no turn or step in between), Camel/Sit/Change Sit combination spin (minimum 6 total revolutions)

Event: Short Program

Test levels are the same as free skate.

Juvenile/Open Juvenile: 1:40 minutes maximum. Lutz Jump, Axel, Layback spin (ladies), Camel spin (men) minimum 4 revolutions, Spin combination with only one change of foot and once change of position (minimum 4 revolutions on each foot), Combination jump consisting of 2 single jumps or a double and single, step sequence (straight line, circular or serpentine)

Intermediate: 2 minutes maximum. Rules as defined for the 2004-2005 competitive season.

Novice: 2:15 minutes maximum. Rules as defined for the 2004-2005 competitive season.

Junior: 2:50 minutes maximum. Rules as defined for the 2004-2005 competitive season.

Senior: 2:50 minutes maximum. Rules as defined for the 2004-2005 competitive season.

Event: Dairs

- Pre-Juvenile Pairs: 1:30 minutes +/- 10 seconds. Both partners passed Preliminary Pair Test and Pre-Juvenile MIF Test. Program requirements according to 2004-2005 U.S. Figure Skating rulebook.
- **Juvenile Pairs**: 2:15 minutes +/- 10 seconds. Both partners passed Juvenile Pair Test. Program requirements according to 2004-2005 U.S. Figure Skating rulebook.
- Intermediate Pairs: 3 minutes +/- 10 seconds. Both partners passed Intermediate Pair Test. Program requirements according to 2004-2005 U.S. Figure Skating rulebook.
- **Novice Pairs**: Short Program: 2:15 minutes maximum. Long Program: 3:30 minutes. Both partners passed Novice Pair Test. Program requirements according to 2004-2005 U.S. Figure Skating rulebook.
- **Junior Pairs:** Short Program: 2:50 minutes maximum. Long Program: 4 minutes. Both partners passed Junior Pair Test. Program requirements according to 2004-2005 U.S. Figure Skating rulebook.
- Senior Pairs- Short Program: 2:50 minutes maximum. Long Program: 4:30 minutes. Both partners must have passed Senior Pair Test. Program requirements according to 2004-2005 U.S. Figure Skating rulebook.

Event: Solo Dance

Solo dance will consist of one dance per event, and skaters may enter both dances in each level. Skaters may also choose to compete up one level. Men and ladies may be combined. All introductions must not exceed 8 measures of music. Qualifying restrictions are listed next to each individual dance level.

Preliminary (no more than 1 pre-bronze dance passed)

Dances Offered: Dutch Waltz (2 patterns), Rhythm Blues (2 patterns)

Pre-Bronze (no more than 1 bronze dance passed)

Dances Offered: Swing Dance (2 pattern), Cha Cha (2 patterns)

Bronze (no more than 1 pre silver dance passed)

Dances Offered: Hickory Hoedown (2 patterns), Willow Waltz (2 patterns)

Pre-Silver (no more than 1 silver dance passed)

Dances Offered: Fourteen Step (4 patterns), European Waltz (2 patterns)

Silver (no more than 1 pre-gold dance passed)

Dances Offered: Rocker Foxtrot (3 patterns), Tango (2 patterns)

Pre-Gold (no more than 1 gold dance passed)

Dances Offered: Starlight Waltz (2 patterns), Paso Doble (2 patterns)

Gold (no more than 1 International dance passed)

Dances Offered: Quickstep (3 patterns), Westminster Waltz (2 patterns)

Event: Spins

Test requirements are the same as listed for free skating events. Men and Ladies may be grouped together. All levels will be skated on 1/2 ice surface, without music. Spins must be skated exactly as stated, but may be skated in any order. Connecting moves may be included, such as short sequences of footwork, and are for the sole purpose of maneuvering between spins and will not be judged.

Pre-Preliminary: 1:00 minute maximum. One-foot spin, optional free foot (minimum 3 revolutions), Sit Spin (minimum 3 revolutions), One-foot upright back spin (minimum 3 revolutions)

Preliminary: 1:00 minute maximum. Camel spin (minimum 3 revolutions), Forward Sit Spin (minimum 3 revolutions), One-foot upright back spin (minimum 3 revolutions)

Pre-Juvenile: 1:30 minutes maximum. Camel Spin (minimum 4 revolutions), Camel Spin to Sit Spin (minimum 3 revolutions each position), Front scratch to back scratch spin (minimum 4 revolutions each foot)

Juvenile/Open Juvenile: 1:30 minutes maximum. Forward sit spin (minimum 4 revolutions), Layback—ladies, Forward Camel— men (minimum 4 revolutions), Combination spin with one change of foot (minimum 4 revolutions each foot)

EVENT: SPINS (continued)

Intermediate: 1:30 minutes maximum. Change foot sit spin (minimum 4 revolutions each foot in position), Flying Camel Spin (minimum 5 revolutions), Combination Spin consisting of one change of foot and one change of position (minimum of 4 revolutions on each foot)

Novice: 1:30 minutes maximum. Layback—ladies, sit spin— men (minimum 6 revolutions in position), Camel spin to back camel spin (minimum 4 revolutions each foot in position), Spin combination consisting of one change of position and one change of foot (minimum 5 revolutions each foot)

Junior: 1:30 minutes maximum. Flying Sit Spin (minimum 6 revolutions), Layback—ladies, crossfoot— men (minimum 6 revolutions), Spin Combination consisting of three changes of position and one change of foot (minimum of 5 revolutions on each foot)

Senior: 1:30 minutes maximum. Flying spin of choice (minimum 6 revolutions) chosen position attained in air, Camel Change Camel Spin (minimum 5 revolutions each foot), Spin combination with at least three changes of position and one change of foot (minimum of 10 revolutions)

Event: Artistic Showcase

Showcase events are to be skated to music. Vocals are permitted. Programs should be designed specifically to entertain and/or to move the audience emotionally. The skater will have 30 seconds to place and remove any props. (No props are allowed on ice during warm-up.) Test requirements are the same as for free skate levels.

Beginner: 1:15 minutes +/- 10 seconds. No Axels or double jumps.

Pre-Preliminary & Preliminary: 1:30 minutes +/- 10 seconds. No Axels or double jumps.

Pre-Juvenile & Juvenile: 1:30 minutes +/- 10 seconds. Maximum 4 full revolution jumps. Axel permitted. Intermediate & Above: 1:30 minutes +/- 10 seconds. Maximum 4 full revolution jumps. Axel permitted. Adult: 1:30 minutes +/- 10 seconds. Age 25 and over as of May 31, 2005. No Axels or double jumps.
