MISSION STATEMENT: to give Colorado skaters a chance to develop their USFS Basic Skills in a fun, competitive environment.

AWARDS: During the competition season, skaters will have the chance to compete at five different arenas and earn points for a final standing. Trophies will be awarded at the conclusion of the CSI Basic Skills competition on September 16th to the skaters with the highest point totals who compete in at least 3 of the 5 scheduled competitions FOR EACH LEVEL and a separate trophy for the winner of the Dance series.

Freeskate and Elements/Compulsory Program Series Point System

A skater must enter **BOTH** Freeskating **AND** the Compulsory/Elements event in each of at least 3 of the 5 registered Series Basic Skills Competitions to be eligible for accumulating points. Each event will have a maximum of 6 skaters. Both youth and adults may accumulate points!

The system for scoring points for the trophies will be as follows:

1 st place	6 points
2 nd place	5 points
3 rd place	4 points
4 th place	3 points
5 th place	2 points
6 th place	1 point

If an event has 2-6 skaters, the points will be awarded as if there were 6 skaters in the group. If there is only one skater in the group, they will be awarded 3 points.

In case of a tie, the total number of skaters that the competitor has skated against will be the tie breaker.

All points follow the skater throughout the year so if a skater moves up to higher levels, the points follow them to the higher level.

Trophies will be awarded (1-3 place) in each level (Snowplow Sam through Freeskate 6). The trophies will be awarded to the skaters at their level as of the last competition in the series.

Please note: Spin, Dance, Pair, Theater on Ice, Synchronized team, and Showcase events will not be counted in the final standings. Beyond The Basics events will not be counted in the Freeskate and Elements/Compulsory Program series.

Solo Dance Series Point System

A skater must enter at least 1 solo dance event in at least 2 of the 5 registered Series Basic Skills Competitions to be eligible for accumulating points. Each event will have a maximum of 6 skaters

The system for scoring points for the trophies will be as follows:

If an event has less than 6 skaters, the points will be awarded as if there were 6 skaters in the group. If there is only one skater in the group, they will be awarded 3 points.

All points follow the skater throughout the year so if a skater moves up to higher levels, the points follow them to the higher level.

In case of a tie, the total number of skaters that the competitor has skated against will be the tie breaker.

One trophy will be awarded to the skater with the most points in this series.

Please note: ONLY dance events count in this series. This is a separate series from the Freeskate/Elements/Compulsory Program series.

Rules and Format:

COMPETITION ANNOUNCEMENT

The **USFS Skate Colorado Basic Skills Competition Series** is sponsored equally by the 5 participating ice rinks and/or USFS member clubs. Competition packages will be available at all participating ice rinks and/or via the club or rink websites. Each competition will have its own entry forms and specific rules so please make sure to read the entire announcement for each competition.

ELIGIBILITY RULES FOR PARTICIPANTS

The competition is open to ALL skaters who are current eligible (ER 1.00) member of either the Basic Skills Program and/or are full members of US Figure Skating. To be eligible, skaters must have submitted a membership application or be a member in good standing. Members of other organization are eligible to compete, but must be registered with the host Basic Skills Program/Club or any other Basic Skills Program/Club.

Eligibility for each competition will be based on skill level as of the closing date of that competition. All SNOWPLOW SAM and BASIC SKILLS SKATERS THROUGH BASIC 8 must skate at the highest level passed and **NO** official US Figure Skating tests may have been passed including MITF or individual Dances.

Skaters in other events may skate at the highest level passed OR one level higher BUT not both levels in the same event during the same competition and <u>may have passed</u> Pre-Preliminary MITF. For events that are "Beyond the Basics" (Beginner, Pre-Preliminary, and Preliminary), the US Figure Skating Rulebook #1032 applies.

It is very important to the success of the series that skaters are placed in the correct divisions. If, for whatever reason, the local organizing committee discovers that a skater has been placed in a category that is below their class level, the chair and referee will have the option to move the skater to the proper division, even if this has to be done the day of the competition. This will ensure that every event is as fair as possible to the competitors.

- Time 1:00 or less
- Skaters will be divided by age if entries warrant and no more than six skaters per group.
- Male and Female competitors can be combined at the discretion of the referee and LOC if entries are not sufficient to create separate events

Freeskate Compulsory Event – Freeskate Curriculum

- The skater must demonstrate the required elements and may use any additional elements from previous levels (where applicable)
- The skating order of the required elements is optional (elements may not be repeated)
- To be skated on ½ ice no music permitted
- In program form, using a limited number of connecting steps
- Time: 1:00 or less
- Deductions will be made if elements from a higher lever are performed
- Skaters will be divided by age if entries warrant and no more than six skaters per group.
- Male and Female competitors can be combined at the discretion of the referee and LOC if entries are not sufficient to create separate events

Basic Programs with Music

- Program duration: 1:00 +/- 10 sec To be skated on full ice Vocal music is allowed
- Deductions will be made if elements from a higher lever are performed
- Programs must contain all the required elements listed
- Skaters will be divided by age if entries warrant and no more than six skaters per group.
- Male and Female competitors can be combined at the discretion of the referee and LOC if entries are not sufficient to create separate events

Freeskate Programs 1-6 with music and Adults

- Program duration: 1:30 +/- 10 sec To be skated on full ice Vocal music is NOT allowed
- Deductions will be made if elements from a higher lever are performed

Competition Specific Information:

The registration desk will be located in the lobby of Sertich Ice Center and should open 1 hour prior to the first scheduled practice ice session of the competition. Please register promptly when you arrive at the ice arena.

<u>Music must be submitted at the time of registration and be a CD</u>. We can provide a tape to CD conversion at the registration desk for a \$5.00 charge.

Each division, which will be divided by age, will include no more than six competitors. Medals will be awarded 1-6th place. Awards will be presented at the photographer's table, and all skaters in each group will be included in the awards photo as soon as possible after the posting of results.

Professional photographs will be available for purchase. The committee will make every attempt to ensure that the cost is reasonable. **NO FLASH PHOTOGRAPHY** is allowed in the rink area during competition. Flash photography is dangerous to the skaters! The competition committee reserves the right to remove anyone from the rink who ignores requests and warnings regarding the use of flash photography.

Skater and Coaches schedules will be posted on the web at: www.centennialskatingclub.org

Skaters will be able to choose their own practice ice sessions online after the schedule is posted but you must indicate how many sessions you want and pay for them in advance.

Skaters will be able to pick their own practice ice sessions online this year but you MUST indicate number of sessions you want on the practice ice form and you MUST pay for them with your entry form. You must include a self-addressed stamped envelope with your entry in which you will receive a PIN number in order to access your practice ice records and select your sessions. Practice ice will be available at Sertich Ice Center starting on Tuesday or Wednesday, September 11 or 12 in the evening depending on number of entries. Charge for the 30 minute session is \$9.00 in advance and \$12.00 at the rink. Please fill out the enclosed practice ice request form.

Notification of competition and practice ice times will NOT be available by phone. Skater and Coaches schedules will be available via the web at www.centennialskatingclub.org. Persons using checks without sufficient funds will be charged an additional \$30.00 fee per check. All further payments must be made by cash, money order, or certified funds. Skaters will not be allowed to practice or compete until all such debts are satisfied.

The host hotel is the La Quinta Inns and Suites located at 2750 Geyser Drive near the Colorado Springs World Arena. Entry forms must be RECEIVED BY July 31, 2007. Entries received after July 31, 2007 will be considered late, and will be accepted at the discretion of the Chief Referee. Late entries will be assessed a \$30.00 late fee. The competition committee reserves the right to limit entries in any event or to cancel an event. Entry fees will only be refunded in accordance with refund policy below. If you wish to be notified that your application has been received, include a self-addressed stamped postcard and it will be mailed to you upon receipt.

Refund Policy

Full refunds are available if withdrawal is prior to July 31, 2007. After July 31, 2007, entry refunds are only available if the competition is not held or there is a death in the competitor's immediate family. There will be NO medical refunds given.
