Purpose: The Cleveland Invitational Championships (CIC's) are held to stimulate interest in figure skating and to afford a competitive experience for skaters. The competition will be conducted according to the current U.S. Figure Skating rules. Skaters may skate only for their Home Club. CIC's is part of the Tri-State Series and the National Solo Dance Series.

Eligibility: Previously limited to Cleveland-area skaters, CIC's is open to all skaters from any club. Skaters may not compete below their test level as of February 3, 2012. In most cases, skaters may compete at their test level as of February 3, 2012 or at one level higher (but not both within the same category). See pages 4 through 11 for details.

6.0 events with a large number of entries will be divided into smaller groups by birth date. IJS events will be arranged by random draw and will have a Final Round if there are more than 24 entries (per rule #2466). Events will be divided into groups by male and female. However, the Pavilion Skating Club reserves the right to combine male and female skaters if there are fewer than two (2) entries in any event at the Pre-Preliminary, Preliminary and Pre-Juvenile levels. Events with only one competitor will not be held. Fees for cancelled events (only) will be refunded.

Entry Fees: Please refer to Entry Forms

Other Fees: Please ensure you have checked the correct boxes when completing your registration form. If you incorrectly mark a box that results in the event needing to be changed, you will be assessed a \$20 fee per changed event. Absolutely no changes will be made to the schedule after 5 days from the publication date of the schedule. There will be a service charge assessed of \$30 for all NSF checks. Cashier's check or a money order will be the only payments accepted for the fee for NSF checks.

IJS/PPCS: Competitors in IJS events are required to submit a Planned Program Content Sheet (PPCS).

The PPCS is to be completed online with U.S. Figure Skating before March 13, 2012. For those who do not submit a Planned Program Content Sheet online before March 13th, a \$25 processing fee per IJS event will be assessed. Please note that any PPCS submitted by paper will incur a \$25 processing fee per IJS event, regardless of date. Once entered, PPCS may be updated online at any time and as often as desired without cost up to March 13th. Please go to www.usfsa.org and log in to the Members Only section. You will need your U.S. Figure Skating number and password. Go to Event Registration and Online Event Registration, then to Event Manager and Program Content and register your forms under Cleveland Invitational Championships.

- Refunds:** No refunds will be issued for any reason including medical after the closing date of February 3, 2012 unless an event is cancelled.
- Deadline:** **Completed applications and entry fees must be postmarked by February 3, 2012.** If space permits applications may be accepted after this date, however a \$15 late fee will be assessed. A parent or guardian AND a club official must sign the application. Incomplete applications will not be accepted.

- Facilities:** Two ice surfaces will be used for CIC's. One is Olympic-size (200' x 100'). The other is 185' x 85'. The Cleveland Heights Community Center has dressing rooms, concessions, and parking. Several vendors will be present as well as a photographer and videographer to capture those special moments. Please note that your entry fee includes a DVD of the entire flight of each of your skater's events.
- Registration:** On the day of the competition, all skaters must check in at the Registration Desk located in the rink lobby. The Registration Desk will be open throughout the competition. Skaters should be at the rink, checked in, and ready to compete one hour prior to the scheduled time of their event.
- Music:** Music will be reproduced through the arena sound system from **CDs only**, which are furnished by each skater. Skaters are required to deliver their music to the Registration Desk at the time of registration and at least one hour before the event warm up time. All music must be turned in properly labeled at the time of registration. Maxell brand CDs are NOT preferred. Please use the CD type CD-R Music. The LOC will not be held responsible for CD's that do not play properly, so it is recommended that you have back-ups. All skaters should have appropriate backup music with them at rink side during their events. Music should be reclaimed at the Registration Desk following the event. All music is +/- 10 seconds unless it states maximum. Vocal music with lyrics is **not** permitted for Novice through Senior level Free Skate events.
- Awards:** Medals will be awarded for 1st through 3rd place for each event including any final rounds.
- Trophies:** **Only Greater Cleveland member clubs are eligible for the following trophies.**
- Tonia Kwiatkowski Award for Novice Ladies Free Skating Trophy** will be presented to the winner of the Novice Ladies Free Skating Event. A traveling trophy will be presented to be displayed in the home rink of the winner. A plaque will also be presented for the winner to keep. In the event of more than one Free skating group of Novice Ladies, a final round consisting of the long program will be required to determine the winner of the trophy.
- The Bill Coyle Dance Trophy** will be awarded to the club winning the most points in all the dance events. For Dance events with skaters from two different clubs, the points will be split. This is a traveling trophy.
- The Winterhurst Maneuver Team Trophy** will be awarded to the club winning the most points in all maneuver team events. This trophy is a traveling trophy.

The Joy Cunningham-William Wall Cleveland Invitational Championship Club Trophy will be awarded to the club winning the most points. Points will be awarded as follows: 1st place – 4 points, 2nd place – 3 points, 3rd place – 2 points, 4th place – 1 point with the number of points reduced in events with fewer than 4 skaters. For Dance and Pair events with skaters from two different clubs, the points will be split. Maneuver teams will not be included in the point total. This is a traveling trophy.

Event Schedule: A competition schedule, practice ice and all updates will be available on the Pavilion Skating Club website, www.pavilionfsc.com. Please check the website for any and all updates prior to the competition.

Practice Ice: Practice Ice will be available. Please see the Practice Ice application which will be published with the competition schedule.

Scoring: The IJS system will be used for Juvenile through Senior Ladies and Men Free Skating and Juvenile through Senior Ladies and Men Short Program. The 6.0 scoring system will be used for all other events.

Directions to Cleveland Heights Community Center:

From the West:

Take 480-East to Exit 25B (Warrensville Rd NORTH). Stay on Warrensville North for about 6 miles, then left on Mayfield Rd. Stay on Mayfield for 1.8 miles. Turn right onto Monticello and then an immediate left into the Cleveland Heights Community Center parking lot.

From the East:

Take I-90 West to I-271 South via Exit 188. Take Exit 36 (Wilson Mills Rd). Turn right (west) onto Wilson Mills. Stay on Wilson Mills for 2.5 miles. At that point, Wilson Mills becomes Monticello. Continue straight on Monticello for 4.5 miles. Cleveland Heights Community Center will be on the right.

From the South:

Take I-271 North to Exit 34 (Mayfield Rd/US 322 WEST) toward Mayfield Heights. Stay on Mayfield/322 going west for 6 miles. Turn right onto Monticello Blvd and then an immediate left into the Cleveland Heights Community Center parking lot.

Free Skate –For the most part, Skaters may compete at their current free skate test level or one level higher but **not** both (see Pre-Prelim and Adult Pre-Bronze for exceptions). Programs are to be skated on full ice. See *’s below for IJS scoring events.

Compulsory - Skaters may compete at their current free skate test level or one level higher, but **not** both (see Pre-Prelim for exception). Programs are to be skated on half ice with no music. Elements must be skated exactly as stated but may be skated in any order. Additional jumps or spins are not permitted and deductions will be taken for each occurrence.

Spins – Skaters may compete at their current free skate test level or one level higher, but **not** both (see Pre-Prelim for exception). Programs are to be skated on half ice with no music. Elements must be skated exactly as stated but may be skated in any order. Additional jumps or spins are not permitted and deductions will be taken for each occurrence.

Test Track: Skaters may compete at their current free skate test level or one level higher, but **not** both (see Pre-Prelim for exception). Skaters may enter EITHER the test track free skate program or the well-balanced free skate program but **NOT** both. Competitors will skate to music of their choice. Vocal music is permitted. Deductions will be made as follows: 0.1 from EACH mark for each technical element included that is not permitted in the event description, 0.2 from the technical mark for each extra element, and 0.1 for any spin with less than required revolutions. Programs are to be skated on a full sheet of ice.

Special Dance - may select dances at their current test level and/or one level higher. Each dance is considered an event and judged separately. These events will be performed on full ice.

2012 National Solo Dance Competition Series

Overview:

U.S Figure Skating is pleased to announce the 2011-12 Solo Dance competition series. This program began in the 2010-11 season and is open to individual skaters within the Eastern, Midwestern and Pacific Coast sections. Skaters participating in at least two competitions within their respective sections accumulate points based upon placement that will be used to determine qualification of individual skaters to the National Solo Dance Championships.

The 2012 CIC's is a part of U.S. Figure Skating's National Solo Dance Series. However, 2012 CIC's will offer Solo Pattern Dance only (no Solo Free Dance). If you are not a registered U.S. Figure Skating solo Dance Series participant for the current season, you may still compete in this event. If you are registered, you must compete at your registered level for the entire Season. Otherwise, your points will not accumulate.

The chief referee has selected two pattern dances per level at random (please refer to chart below). A combined score will determine final placement. Skaters must compete both dances.

Solo Pattern Dance Test Level:

All skaters must either compete at their test level or one level above their highest completed dance test. The determination of level will be based upon test level at the entry deadline**.

The test level is determined by a skater completing all of the dance tests within that level.

*** Test level may be either standard or solo dance. Adult dance, adult solo dance, master's dance and master's solo dance do not fulfill the testing requirements for this event.*

Judging System:

The 6.0 judging system will be used for all events and levels at Solo Dance Competitions. The ISU judging system will not be used.

Notes on the conduct of the competition:

All dance events may be double-paneled at the discretion of the referee. When there are more than 18 athletes in a solo dance event, the event will be split so no flight has more than 18 skaters. *Ladies will skate the ladies' steps and men will skate the men's steps, no exceptions.*

Officials:

Officials will be chosen from both competition and test level judges.

How it works:

At each Solo Dance competition, skaters earn qualifying points based on their final, overall combined placement at the competition. Skaters may earn qualifying points at either:

- a) three (3) competitions within their section
- b) two (2) competitions within their section **and** one(1) competition outside of their section

Note: Skaters must compete in AT LEAST two (2) competitions within their section to be eligible to compete at the National Solo Dance Championships.

Top six (6) skaters from each section (who have competed in at least two nonqualifying competitions), in each level (Pattern dance levels: preliminary, pre-bronze, bronze, pre-silver, silver, pre-gold and gold and Solo Free Dance levels: juvenile, intermediate, novice, junior and senior) will receive an invitation to advance to the National Solo Dance Championships. A variation of a fill-up rule may be used if less than six skaters qualify at any particular level. This will allow for an overall total of 18 skaters in each level at the National Solo Dance Championships.

Maneuver Team Competition

A figure skating club may enter two teams in each level for a maximum of eight teams per club. Skaters may only skate for their home club. Both boys and girls may skate on one team. There are three to five members per team with one maneuver being performed by each skater and no skater should perform more than two maneuvers. Should a skater be unable to compete due to illness or injury, a teammate may do his maneuver with proper notice to the referee of this event. There must be a minimum of three skaters to compete as a team. A skater may skate on one team only. No award points will be given for Maneuver Team events.
