## 2016 Michigan Basic Skills Series Competition Mission Statement

To give our skaters a chance to develop their USFS Basic Skills in a fun competitive environment. During the competition season - skaters will have the chance to compete at many different clubs and arenas and earn points for a final standing.

A skater may participate in either Freeskating and/or Compulsory/Elements events in any of the Michigan Basic Skills Series Competitions to be eligible for accumulating points. Awards will be presented to skaters with the highest point totals. These awards will take place - on the ice - at the Midland Competition - November 5, 2016

## Series Point System

The Freeskating events and the Compulsory/Elements events in each of the Series Competitions will be eligible for accumulating points. Each event will have a maximum of 6 skaters. The system for scoring points for the final award will be as follows:

| $1^{\text {st }}$ Place | 6 points |
| :---: | :---: |
| $2^{\text {nd }}$ Place | 5 points |
| $3^{\text {rd }}$ Place | 4 points |
| $4^{\text {th }}$ Place | 3 points |
| $5^{\text {th }}$ Place | 2 points |
| $6^{\text {th }}$ Place | 1 point |

In the event of tied total points, all skaters tied for a place will be awarded a medal, no ties will be broken.
Points are accumulated for Compulsory and Free Skate events separately.
Medals will be awarded (1-3 Place) in each level as highlighted in each announcement. Beyond the Basics will NOT be counted in the Freeskate and Elements/Compulsory Program Series for this 2016 season. Spins, Dance, Pairs,

Theatre On Ice, Synchronized Teams, and Showcase Events will NOT be counted for this 2016 season.
At the end of the 2016 Series Season any skaters who moved up a level will be awarded 6 bonus points [6 points only whether they move up one level or more]. All points follow the skater throughout the year.

Please Note: The USFS Michigan Basic Skills Series is sponsored equally by all the participating ice rinks and/or USFS member clubs. Competition announcements and packages will be available at all participating ice rinks and/via the club or rink websites as well as www.sk8stuff.com. Each competition will have its own entry forms and specific rules - so please make sure to read the entire announcement for each competition.

The $14^{\text {th }}$ Annual Skate Midland Basic Skills Competition sponsored by the Midland Figure Skating Club will be held at the Midland Civic Arena on November 5, 2016. The ice surface measures $200 \times 100$ feet. This is a United States Figure Skating approved Basic Skills Competition. The sanctions will be posted on the official competition bulletin board. E-mail communications are preferred.

Mission Statement - The purpose of this competition is to promote a fun, introductory, competitive experience for the beginning skater.

Eligibility - The Competition is open to ALL skaters who are current eligible (ER.100) members of either the Basic Skills Program and/or full members of US Figure Skating. To be eligible, skaters must have submitted a membership application or be a member in good standing. Members of other organizations are eligible to compete but must be registered with the host Basic Skills Program/Club or any other Basic Skills Program/Club. Eligibility will be based on skill level as of closing date of entries. All Snowplow Sam and Basic Skills 1-8 skaters must skate at highest level passed or one level higher and NO official U.S. Figure Skating tests may have been passed including MIF or individual dances. For the Test Track and Well Balanced levels, eligibility will be based only upon highest free skate test level passed (moves in the field test level will not determine skater's competitive level). Skaters may skate at highest level passed OR one level higher BUT not both levels in the same event during the same competition

Rules - The competition will be conducted under the rules set forth by the US Figure Skating "Basic Skills Competition Manual" program.

Entry Fees - The first event is $\$ 50.00$, the second event is $\$ 20.00$ and each additional event after that is $\$ 10.00$. entries must be postmarked no later than October 15, 2016. Late entries will be accepted at the discretion of the organizers, and are subject to a possible $\$ 15.00$ late fee. Entry fees are per person, U.S. dollars.

There will be a $\$ 35.00$ fee for returned checks.
Awards - All competitors will receive a medal. All events are final rounds. ALL awards will be made at appropriate times throughout the competition.

Registration - The registration table will be open 1 hour before the competition begins. Skaters will not be allowed to compete until they have registered. Please register at least one hour before your competition time.

Schedule of Events - Schedule will be posted on the Internet at the Figure Skater's Website, www.sk8stuff.com.
Music - The music for all free skating programs with music supplied by skater should be provided on CD. The CD is to be turned in at registration. Competitors must have a spare CD at rink side to be used in case of technical difficulties.

Practice Ice - Practice Ice will be available in 20 -minute sessions. Details will be provided in a mailing prior to the competition date. Sign-in and pay $\$ 8.00$ at the door or pre-register using attached form.

Awards will be handed out and a podium will be available for group and individual photos.

- To be skated on $1 / 3$ to $1 / 2$ ice
- No music
- All elements must be skated in the order listed. Each skater will perform each element only when directed by a judge or referee. Skaters are allowed one retry per element. If skater wants to retry, she/he should raise their hand immediately. If the skater attempts a retry, only the retry will count for that element.

- A 0.2 deduction will be taken for each element performed from a higher level.
- Skaters may have the option to skate one level higher in compulsories than their free skate program.

## WELL BALANCED PROGRAM FREE SKATE

- Skaters will skate to the music of their choice. Vocal music is permitted for pre-preliminary - intermediate.
- Level will be determined by the highest free skate test passed. Skaters may compete at the highest level they have passed, or skate up to one level higher.
- The 6.0 judging system will be used for this event.
- All relevant and appropriate IJS rules will be used. Coaches and athletes are expected to be aware of these rules by reading the documents on www.usfigureskating.org , under "Technical Information," then "Singles/Pairs".

- Level will be determined by the highest free skate test passed. Skaters may compete at the highest level they have passed, or "skate up" to one level higher.
- Minimum number of spin revolutions are in () following the spin description. Revolutions must be in position.
- The following deductions will be taken:
- 0.1 from each mark for each technical element included that is not permitted in the event description.
- 0.2 from the technical mark for each extra element included.
- 0.1 from the technical mark for any spin that is less than the required minimum revolutions.

## SHOWCASE EVENTS:

Showcase events are open to skaters in Basic, Free Skate, Limited Beginner through Preliminary and Adult Bronze. Groups will be divided by number of entries and ages if possible. Skaters must enter at the same level as their free skate event or highest test level of skater's in the group ensemble or production number. If a free skate event is not being entered, skaters must enter at their current test level or one level higher. Vocal music is permitted.

Show costumes are permitted, as long as they do not touch or drag on the ice. Props and scenery must be placed and removed by unaided singles and duet competitors within one minute and by unaided ensemble contestants within two minutes for setup and two minutes for removal. A . 2 deduction will be assessed by the referee against each judges' mark for each five seconds in excess of the time allowed for the performance, for handling props and scenery and for scenery assistance.

Performances will be judged from an entertainment standpoint, for theatrical qualities. Technical skating skills and difficulty will not be rewarded as such; however, skating must be the major element of the performance and be of sufficient quality to support the selected theatrical elements. Unintended falls, poorly executed skating elements and obvious losses of control will reduce contestant's marks. Jump difficulty is not rewarded in showcase; therefore jumps, if choreographed, should be performed with style, flow and confidence. Theatrical elements evaluated will include energy, poise, acting, pantomime, eye contact, choreography, form/extension and the use of props and ice.
6.0 Judging will be used. Deductions will be made for skaters including technical elements not permitted in the event description.

Showcase categories may include:

- Dramatic entertainment: Showcase program utilizing intense emotional skating quality to depict choreographic theme.
- Light entertainment: Showcase program emphasizing such choreographic expressive qualities such as comedy, love and mime while incorporating skating skills.
- Duets: Theatrical/artistic performances by any competitors.

## Solo Pattern Dance

General event parameters:

- Levels are based upon the skaters' highest pattern dance test passed.
- A solo pattern dance competition event will consist of the skater performing two solo pattern dances.
- The patterns to be skated depend upon which quarter of the year the competition is held. The skater will perform the two pattern dances listed for his/her level, based upon the date of the competition. If the competition falls over two quarters (for example, June 30 th - July 2 nd ), the dance will be selected based on the start date of the competition listed in the announcement (in this example, the 2 nd quarter).
- Skaters will complete both of the dances at each level. Dances will be scheduled at the discretion of the Chief Referee for each competition and may be competed consecutively or with a break in-between pattern dances groupings.

- Proper forward and backward stance
- March forward across the ice, 8-10 steps

- Full strides using 45 degree V-push with good recovery using alternating arm drive
- Shuffle stride- explosive powerful alternating heel pushes
- Backwards c-cuts or power pushes on circle/backward outside edge glide on a circle


## Hockey 2

- Alternating forward c-cuts on a straight line
- Scooting or skateboard push, on circle (Right \& Left)
- Backwards march then glide on two feet
- Backward swizzles (2 to 4 in a row)
- Alternating backward c-cuts in a straight line


## Hockey 4

- Forward crossovers on circle (R\&L)
- Forward alternating crossovers down the length of the ice with wide step transitions
- Hockey Stops
- Backward crossovers on circle (R\&L)
- Backward alternating crossovers down ice with wide step transitions.
