The Deborah Burgoyne North American Invitational will be conducted in accordance with the rules and regulations of U.S. Figure Skating, as set forth in the current rulebook, as well as any pertinent updates which have been posted on the U.S. Figure Skating website.

This competition is open to all eligible, restricted, reinstated or readmitted persons as defined by the Eligibility Rules, and is a currently registered member of a U.S. Figure Skating member club, a collegiate club or an individual member in accordance with the current rulebook. Please refer to the current rulebook for non-U.S. Citizens.

ELIGIBILITY/TEST LEVEL:

Skaters must be amateur registered members of U.S. Figure Skating and shall compete at their test level as of January 21, 2020 or one level above, but not both. Skaters must not compete below their test level. At the referee's discretion, men and women may be combined into a single event, and events may be divided or combined by age group, or canceled.

<u>Events are governed by the rules of that event as set forth by U.S. Figure Skating including changes from 2019 Governing Council.</u>

ENTRIES: Online Registration at www.sk8stuff.com is preferred. Checks and voucher still need to be printed and mailed. <a href="mailto:CANADIAN COMPETITORS PLEASE NOTE ON CHECK "PAYABLE IN U.S. FUNDS" OR "USD". All entries must be postmarked no later than January 21, 2020. Late entries will be accepted at the discretion of the Competition Committee and will require a \$25.00 late entry fee. Any change to skating level or event after the deadline is subject to a \$15.00 administration fee. A \$25.00 service fee will be assessed for returned/NSF checks. If these fees apply they must be paid before the skater competes. Schedules will be posted on sk8stuff.com and at wyandottefsc.net

<u>REFUND POLICY:</u> No refunds will be granted except if the referee and/or Competition Committee eliminate an event. This includes medical reasons.

AGE CATEGORIES:

The following age categories apply to all events:

Young Adult: 18 to 20 years

Class I: 21 to 35 years

Class II: 36 to 45 years

Class III: 46 to 55 years

Class IV: 56 to 65 years

Class V: 66 years and over



FACILITIES: All events will be held at the Benjamin F. Yack Recreation Center, 3131 3rd Street, Wyandotte, Michigan. Wyandotte is located 20 miles southwest of Detroit, with the closest airport being Detroit Metro. The ice surface measures 85' wide by 185' long, with rounded corners and a hockey barrier. Dressing Rooms will be available.

<u>MUSIC:</u> The official competition music must be turned in at the registration table at the time of check-in. A duplicate CD should be readily available "at rinkside." CDs must contain one 1 (one) track readable on a standard CD player. Music may be picked up at the registration table following each event. Every reasonable care will be taken, but the Wyandotte FSC cannot be responsible for CDs left at the end of the competition. Please have separate CDs for practice and competition.

LIABILITY: U.S. Figure Skating, (Wyandotte Figure Skating Club), and (Benjamin F. Yack Recreation Center) accept no responsibility for injury or damage sustained by any participant in this competition. This is in accordance with Rule 1600 of the official U.S. Figure Skating Rulebook.

JUDGING SYSTEM:

<u>IJS will be used for the Free Skating events at the Silver through Masters levels for SINGLES FREESKATING EVENTS ONLY</u> and the 6.0 Majority Judging System will be used for ALL other events.

All competitors skating in these events need to submit the planned program content form online. This form is found in the Member's Only section at www.usfigureskating.org. The deadline to submit the form is January 27, 2020. Competition registered under Wyandotte Adult Competition and/or Deborah Burgoyne North American Invitational

<u>REGISTRATION:</u> Registration will be open one hour before the first event and run through the last event of the day. The registration table will be located in Small Warming Room (inside the arena, next to the concession stand). Competitors must check in at least 1 hour before their event.

PRACTICE ICE: You will be notified of practice schedules and tentative competition schedule as soon as it is provided by the referee. It will be posted on www.sk8stuff.com. No music will be played on practice ice.

SCRATCHES: If you become unable to compete, please be courteous to your fellow competitors and organizing committee by contacting <u>wyandotteskater@msn.com</u> as soon as possible. No refunds will be issued for scratched events.

<u>AWARDS:</u> <u>Medals will be awarded to 1st through 4th places.</u> Check the awards schedule for the time of the award ceremonies.

<u>OFFICIAL NOTICES:</u> An official bulletin board will be maintained in the Registration Room (located inside the arena.) It is the responsibility of each competitor, parent and coach to check the bulletin board frequently for any schedule changes and/or additional information. Skaters are requested to arrive one hour prior to the scheduled time of their event. A tentative schedule of events will be posted prior to the competition.



INFORMATION REGARDING COACHES:

U.S. Figure Skating Rule MR 5.11 Coach Compliance

In order to be granted access to work within U.S. Figure Skating sanctioned activities, each coach must complete the following requirements on an annual basis by July 1:

- A. Must be a current full member of U.S. Figure Skating either through a member club or as an individual member;
- B. Must complete the coach registration process through the U.S. Figure Skating Members Only site, submit proper payment for the annual registration fee of \$30 and, if 18 years of age or older, successfully pass the background screen.
- C. Must complete the appropriate CER courses (A,B, C or D) depending on the highest level of students being coached as of July 1. See rule MR 5.12.
- D. Must submit proof of current general liability insurance with limits of \$1 million per occurrence/\$5 million aggregate.

The local organizing committee/club will have a list of compliant coaches who are cleared for a credential at the competition. Coaches will need to check in at the event registration desk and show a government issued photo I.D. to receive a credential.

If a coach cannot provide a photo I.D. and is not on the list or cannot produce the necessary documents, he or she will not be allowed a credential – <u>no exceptions</u>. We strongly urge all coaches to have their cards with them. Non-credentialed coaches will not be permitted in the designated coaching area at rink side during events including practice sessions. Coaching at U.S. Figure Skating events without compliance is an ethics violation which is reported to U.S. Figure Skating and PSA.

SINGLES FREE SKATING:

The following events will be skated on full ice, to music of the skater's choice. Vocal music is permitted for all events as per Rule 6040. Skaters may compete at or one level higher than their current US Figure Skating freeskate test level. Well-Balanced Program rules apply for all free skating events. Please refer to Well-Balanced Program requirements and links from the US Figure Skating website: http://www.usfigureskating.org and to the most current US Figure Skating rulebook. References to specific test requirements and well-balanced program descriptions from the current rulebook are stated below. Age groups may be combined at the discretion of the referee and consultation with skaters depending on number of entries.

Adult Gold (IJS):	Rule 6530	Time 2:40 max.

PAIRS FREE SKATING:

Well-Balanced Program rules apply for all free skating events. Please refer to Well-Balanced Program requirements linked from the Adult Skating page of the US Figure Skating website: http://www.usfigureskating.org and to the most current US Figure Skating rulebook. References to specific test requirements and well-balanced program descriptions from the current rulebook are stated below. Events may be combined at the discretion of the referee and consultation with skaters depending on number of entries.

Showcase Events:

DRAMATIC, LIGHT ENTERTAINMENT, AND DUET EVENTS: All Showcase events shall be conducted according to the current National Showcase guidelines. These can be found at www.usfigureskating.org, under "Programs" on the National Showcase page. Dramatic Skate, Light Entertainment Skate, and Duet events are separate events, and a skater may enter any or all of these events.

Format:

- Dramatic Skate: Programs should express intense emotional connection and investment in the music, choreography and theme concept through related skating movements, gestures and physical actions.
- Light Entertainment Skate: Showcase program that should express a carefree concept or storyline designed to uplift and entertain the audience through related skating movements, gestures and physical actions.
- Props and Scenery are permitted. Please refer to the National Showcase guidelines for specifics on props, scenery, and costumes.
- Technical skating skills and difficulty will not be rewarded. Jump difficulty is not rewarded in showcase; therefore, jumps, if choreographed, should be performed with style, flow, and confidence.
- The 6.0 judging system will be used. One mark will be awarded by each judge for each performance. No technical skating mark will be awarded.

<u>Pre-Bronze – Gold, Masters Compulsory Moves</u>

- Pre-Bronze through Silver: Elements skated on $\frac{1}{2}$ ice surface
- Gold through Masters: Elements skate on full-ice surface Elements may be performed only once
- Music is not allowed
- Minimum number of revolutions in noted in parentheses A 0.2 deduction will be taken for each element, MISSING, REPEATED, or from a HIGHER LEVEL
